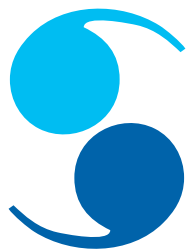

Dr Angela Morgan is a Senior Research Fellow at the Murdoch

Children's Research Institute. Her current research examines the neurobiological bases of childhood communication disorders. Angela's interest in applying cross-disciplinary methods in speech pathology was sparked by her post-doctoral training in neuroimaging techniques. Angela will present the Elizabeth Usher Memorial Lecture.
