

1949 – The Australian College of Speech Therapists (ACST) was established.



1974 – The title used for members of the profession changed from speech therapist to speech pathologist.

1975 – The College (ACST) changed its name to Australian Association of Speech and Hearing (AASH) and the National Office was established.



1996 – The name of the Association was officially changed to Speech Pathology Association of Australia, with the public name being Speech Pathology Australia. A new logo and by-line – 'giving people a say in life' – was also developed as part of the total marketing strategy.
